From London

Get on ON-401 W. Follow 401 W to Iona Station. Take exit 157 for Iona Road/County Road 14 toward Melbourne/Iona. Turn left (south) onto Iona Rd/County Rd 14. Turn right (west) onto Talbot Line/Elgin County Rd 3 (signs for Wallacetown/County Road 3). Turn left (south) onto McKillop Rd. Turn left (east) onto Warwick Line.

From Chatham

Get on ON-401 E toward London. Follow ON-401 E to Graham Rd/County Rd 76 in West Elgin. Take exit 137 toward Graham Rd/County Rd 76. Continue on Graham Rd/County Rd 76 south to Eagle. Turn left (east) onto Talbot Line/Elgin County Rd 3 (signs for County Road 3/St. Thomas/Wallacetown). Turn right (south) onto McKillop Rd. Turn left (east) onto Warwick Line
